10 DAYS OF PRAYER:

Thy Kingdom Come

Ascension to Pentecost: 5 - 15 May

Each year for the past six years Bishop Steven has led and encouraged the Diocese to pray individually and together in the 10 days between Ascension and Pentecost. This year this time coincides with the Archbishop of Canterbury writing to every Parish inviting them also to join together in a time of prayer for the evangelisation of our nation.

The focus for our prayers as a Diocese during this time is: for all Christians to deepen their relationship with Jesus, so that we may have confidence to share our faith; and that all may respond to the call of Jesus Christ to follow

Him. "Jesus Christ calls every person to follow him. As Christians it's our duty and joy to share that invitation."

On Sunday 15 May at 4pm there will be a service in Rotherham Minster led by Bishop Steven to celebrate Spirituality and Evangelism in the Diocese to which all are invited. This will mark the end of the 10 Days of Prayer.

Shefffield Cathedral will set aside 25 minutes

each weekday for prayer and meditation for the duration of the 10 Days of Prayer in The Chapel of the Holy Spirit.
